Purpose: to help formulate higher-level thinking questions

How: pick a word from the row on the left and one from the top column; then, add an ending to your question

(e.g. Why would the character solve the problem this way?)

Levels: where the left row and top column intersect, it tells you the level and skill-type of your question (level 4 highest)
